The AMA Pro Grand National Championship is the oldest and most traditional form of motorcycle racing, tracing its roots back to the early 1900's when young dare-devils tested each other on county fairground ovals all around the United States. In 1954, the first Grand National Champion was crowned as Joe Leonard had accumulated the most points in the new series. Since then major changes have come to the series and now 55 years later the AMA Pro Grand National Championship Series will crown the 2009 Grand National Twins Champion, Grand National Singles Champion and the Grand National Pro Singles Champion.

While the motorcycles have evolved greatly, the close, elbow rubbing action remains. Grand National Twins races are contested on half mile and mile ovals with top speeds approaching 140 mph on the miles with twin cylinder bikes ranging from 500cc to 1250cc. The Grand National Singles races are held on short track ovals and TT courses with 450cc single-cylinder production frame machines.

These events will be showcased at prestigious tracks located around the country, however in addition they will also be showcased during Daytona Bike Week, The Red Bull Indianapolis MotoGP weekend, Sturgis Bike Week, and California Bike Week. These happen to be the 4 largest motorcycle events in the nation.

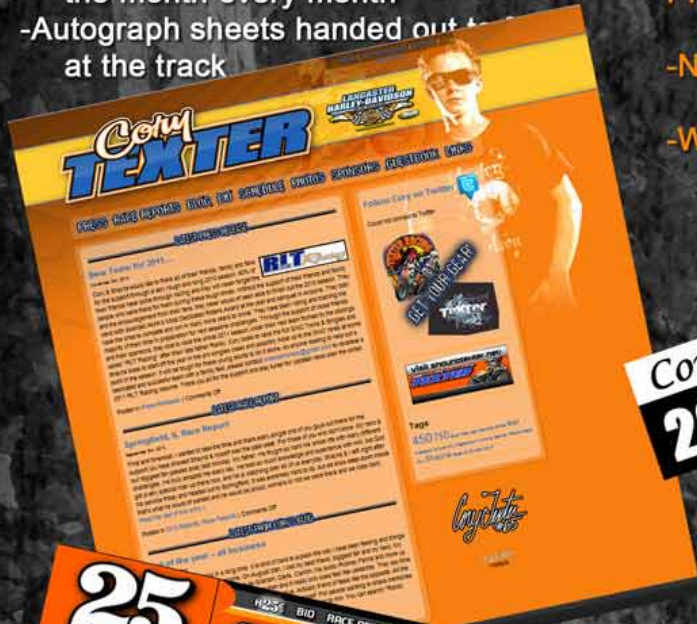

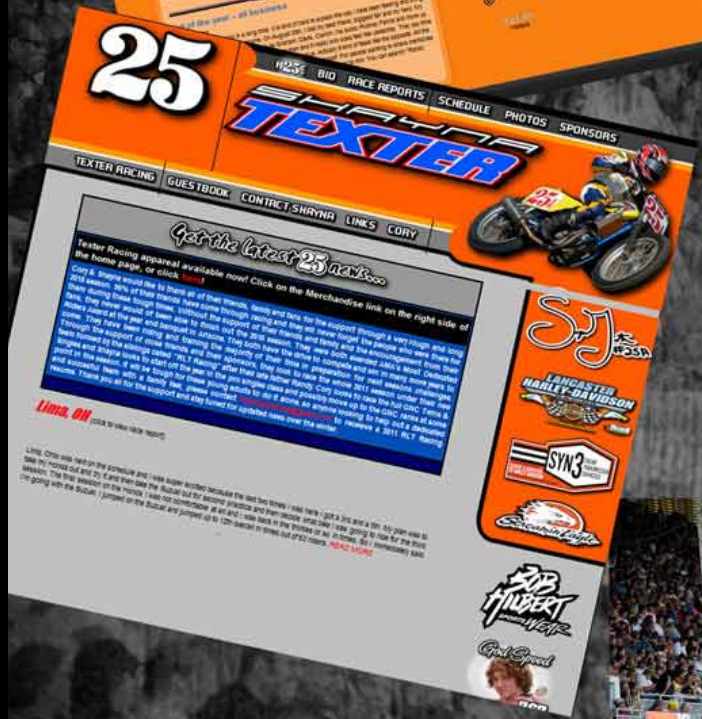
